

Five-Paragraph Essay on the Body-Mind Problem

I love you because you are a unique snowflake. The extent a snowflake can be unique is subject to debate. Humans share twenty-five percent of their DNA with bananas. Given two humans, fallen onto the coat-sleeve of a Brobdingnag, would it be possible to tell us apart? To tell us from bananas? The yellow bananas found in American supermarkets are genetically interchangeable.

You are pale and interesting. Blood vessels can be constricted by, among other means, infecting the subject with the tuberculosis bacillus; dehydration; blood loss; or the ingestion of large quantities of vinegar. Pallor can also be applied in the form of clown white, greasepaint, or foundation makeup.
